






HOLIDAY CLUB AT THE LC

We had a fun filled few days of various activities, from a short walk, interactive fun in the ILS, to Halloween arts, crafts and baking.















MENTAL HEALTH AWARENESS


At the Learning Centre we have been raising our awareness of Mental Health.
